Rotarian **Roland Jacobs** is a native of the Netherlands, where he and his wife met when he was 5 and she was 3. His first professional flying experiences were towing banners and carrying sightseeing passengers. He also flew passengers from Miami to the Bahamas. He then took a job as an engineer at Fokker Elmo, the company for which he still works. After being stationed for 2 years in Toulouse, France, working on a project for Airbus, he worked on different projects with Boeing. He requested that he be assigned to act as Boeing's "quality controller" for Killdeer Mountain Manufacturing, and thus came to Dickinson from the land of tulips, windmills, and wooden shoes.

A native of Regent, **Dave Anderson** grew up in a time of gravel roads and one-room country schools. While in high school in Regent, he played *6-man football*, as well as working with his father on their farm/ranch. The advent of electricity in their home and on the ranch changed their lifestyle, and the creation of Interstate 94 made it possible to travel farther and with more ease. Dave attended NDSU in the fall and winter quarters, helping at home during the spring. It took him 8 ½ years to accumulate the necessary credits for graduation. Dave took over the land that was home, and his son is now on the property that has been in the family for 100 years. He is now retired, and he and wife Marie live in Dickinson.
