November is Rotary Foundation Month

Contributions to Rotary Foundation funds enable Rotarians to carry out humanitarian and educational projects.

Donors may direct their gifts to three main funds: the [Annual Programs Fund](#), which supports the Foundation's humanitarian, educational, and cultural exchange programs worldwide; the [Permanent Fund](#), which provides an endowment; and the [PolioPlus Fund](#).

You can donate to The Rotary Foundation's endowment, the **Permanent Fund**. This fund enables individuals to combine their gifts into a significant force to address the world's greatest needs for generations to come.

The initial target of US\$200 million for the Permanent Fund was met in 2005, six years ahead of schedule. The next target is \$1 billion by 2025.

In a Rotary year, about \$4.5 million from the Permanent Fund is made available to support Foundation programs. Gifts of any size to The Rotary Foundation are appreciated and will support educational, humanitarian, and cultural programs and projects throughout the world.

There are several ways to contribute to Rotary's efforts. One funding effort, The Rotary Centers Gift initiative, is striving to foster world understanding and peace through education. It's working to raise US\$90 million in endowed support for the [Rotary Centers for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution](#).

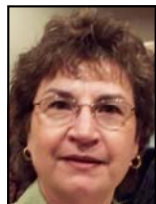
Announcements Last Week:
